

From the Desk of Our Pastor

God's Desire for Us

hen we stop to think about it, not much gets accomplished in this world without desire; desire is a powerful force behind all accomplishments. In fact, we humans get it from God, in whose image we are made. In our Exodus reading for this Sunday, we see that God desires to make a covenant with Israel. A covenant is a kinship bond established by an oath. This is astounding! Covenants were only made between tribes and nations. For God to make a covenant with mortals was totally unheard



of. Israel was unique in that it was chosen to be "family" with God.

There are three desired outcomes that God was looking for. First, that Israel would become His "special possession." This same word is used elsewhere to describe a king's private treasury apart from the national treasure. That God would put such special value on any group of mortals in astounding, let alone this shabby group of desert bunnies. Next, they were to be "kingdom of priests, or a "priestly royalty." This was a dignity lost at the Fall of humanity, who were made to have dominion over the earth, not to exploit it, but to nurture it, and as priests to minister the truth of God to the nations. Finally, they were to become a "holy nation." "Holy" is an attribute of God; they were to walk the earth as uncommon creatures that reflected the glory of God.

In the end, Israel did not desire what God desired for them. They wanted to become common just like all the other nations around them. Where Israel failed, Jesus succeeded. Notice the desire that gushes forth from Him in the Gospel reading for this Sunday; His heart was moved to compassion for all the helpless people around Him. So, what does He do? He sends His disciples out into the world to fulfill God's original desire for Israel.

Let us ask the question truthfully, what do we really want in life? Do we desire for ourselves what God desires for us? We must always resist the urge to "be like everyone else around us" out of fear, laziness, or sheer willfulness. God desires to empower us to accomplish His will in creation as real agents of change, participating in something profound and meaningful.
