

From the Desk of Our Pastor

Finding the Right Words

I am always fumbling around looking for the right words to express what I am thinking. What adds to my loss of words are those thoughts that swarm in the caverns of my head are wispy and fragmented. I need words to clarify my thinking and thinking to clarify my words. This is the dilemma of "word smiths" such as myself, always hopeful to get the right words to express the right thoughts to communicate something that is meaningful and relevant.



We see something like this in the Gospel this week. The

Pharisees, who were very conservative and conscientious about the law, joined with their enemies, the "secular" Herodian's, to trick Jesus with their words. There is a certain power in their question, "is it lawful to pay the census tax to Caesar or not?" It is the power of cunning, crafty, designed to exult the questioner and destroy the one questioned. Jesus outwits them with a counter-question that both answers their question, and exposes their malice.

Jesus, by definition, is the very "Word," or revelation of God, and always speaks with power and profundity. But since the ultimate "Word" is a person, not a mere arrangement of symbolic letters, God wants to take us beyond words and the ideas they convey. This is behind St. Paul's amazing statement, "For our Gospel did not come to you in word alone, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit with much conviction." What I am seeking here at SJCC is something far beyond any clever construction of words and ideas that I can serve up to you in letters and homilies, however good they may be. What I am looking for, and have been looking for since I got here, is to see a profound working of the Holy Spirit, a display of power, not necessarily in me, but working in each and every one of us. Our glory would not be in ourselves, but in God and what He has done.

This would result in a mighty up-swelling of words of praise to God that we see in the Psalm for this week, of joyful song, words of testimony, eager to tell others what God has done in our lives, words that are real and genuine leading to a profound worship of God. That is what I am looking for!




