

From the Desk of Our Associate Pastor

Dear Faithful,

This week (5-11 November) is National Vocations Awareness Week. The US Bishops propose this observance and ask us to pray for an increase in vocations to the priesthood, diaconate, and consecrated life. They also ask us to invite young men and women to consider these particular paths of discipleship.

By our Baptism, we are called to receive the Gospel as a complete, coherent, comprehensive way of life; we are called to be disciples of the Lord Jesus. And to live as true disciples of Christ, everything about



us must be guided by the Gospel: our thoughts, words, deeds, relationships, spending habits, political convictions, leisure activities, lifestyle choices, business decisions—everything. This is our primary vocation: the universal call to holiness.

Beyond this universal vocation to holiness, God calls men and women to particular vocations: marriage and parenthood, the diaconate, the priesthood, the consecrated life. Before discerning the vocation to marriage, men and women owe it to themselves and to the Church to discern whether God is calling them to a celibate vocation.

Some men (like me) are called to ministry, but not to religious life. Some are called to ministry in a diocese, as deacons or priests. Jesus Himself always remains our Shepherd, and He always takes personal care of each of us. But He mediates to us His saving work—including His ministry of Shepherd—through efficacious signs. So He shepherds us through earthly shepherds—our bishops and priests.

We need these pastors: living human beings who have the authority to speak and act in Christ's name. We need them to preach His word; to celebrate and administer the Sacraments; to teach in His name; to visit the sick, bring back the lapsed, and give relief to the poor. Without that activity, Christianity would be reduced to an idea, rather than what it must be: a living reality.

So don't be afraid to recommend to young men the priesthood and the diaconate. An outside word can clarify an inner longing. God continues to call men and is counting on their generosity. We should be encouraged to see more seminarians, more ordinations. It's an assurance that the Lord, here and now, in Maryland in 2023, has not forgotten us. He's at work among us. He still holds us in His care and is bothered about us and His Church in this place. He is still calling and sending and pouring out

His Holy Spirit to equip His disciples for service. He is our Shepherd, and He is with us.


Thanksgiving Collections
