From the Desk of Our Pastor

Handing Down Something Good

I have a sense that there is something extremely important that we must all accomplish together in the next few years. I am not a "spring chicken" and I feel an urgency, especially for our new families an urgency to see God do something that will make us all stand back and say, "God has done great things among us, and it is marvelous in our eyes." Then I could say with Simeon my Nunc Demittis, and make my journey into the sunset.

It is our responsibility to make sure that we pass on to our younger generation something solid, concrete, and



enduring. Unfortunately, not all that was passed on to us was good. Corrupt clergy abused innocent people ruining their lives, and handed us a scandal that drove our Archdiocese into bankruptcy; the injury to our church is incalculable. During the construction of our sanctuary a mere 25 years ago, grave mistakes were made in the construction of the building and support columns. As a result, 10 of the 16 wood columns were found with severe damage due to water infiltration hidden inside the walls, handing down to us a million-dollar-plus repair project.

We may find ourselves angry, but we cannot allow ourselves to be trapped in the past. For the sake of our future generations, we must look forward; we must pass on something more enduring than what we inherited. We must form our families so that they have the knowledge and confidence to catechize our children. We must grow into a liturgy and worship that is full of the good, the true, and the beautiful. We must become a light that shines deep into our parish community and the archdiocese.

Dear brothers and sisters, there is a lot of good here, but we have far to go. On the outside our pillars looked fine, but were deteriorating inside. This can be a metaphor for our spiritual and moral state; looking good on the surface, but not so much underneath. Gone must be the days when only 20% of our congregation supported our mission monetarily. Now is the time to grasp the reality that worship is sacrifice, that we are not "contributors" but debtors to God. I will not beg you for money; He wants you to freely give from your heart as a habitual part of your devotional life.

It is your duty as a disciple of Christ to give regularly and generously. If you do not give regularly already, give consistently a percentage, even if small (e.g. \$10 a week). Next weekend at all Masses, we will be talking more about stewardship and you will be asked to complete the "A Community United" commitment card. This will allow us to plan and allocate our resources. The future of our Church is in our hands.
