From the Desk of Our Pastor

The Truth About "Our" Money

The Parable of the Talents is critically important to Matthew because it is placed as the very last parable before Jesus' passion. It is emphatically the parable He wants to leave imprinted on our minds and hearts. This parable is unapologetically capitalistic in nature! We must invest and increase the money given to us. If not, we face very dark consequences.

It is essential to grasp this one fundamental principle; what we have is not ours but what has been given to us. The servants all have been given varying amounts of



money according to their abilities. The very fact that we all instinctively assume that the money we have is ours is a complete delusion. Who gave us the ability and gifts to make money? Everything we have is a gift, and technically, God owns it and makes demands on it.

The fact that God is "demanding" is what irks the servant who buried his one talent. It is interesting that he is not accused of squandering the money, but burying it. Here the money symbolizes our spiritual gifts; so many of us never even know what our spiritual gifts are, let alone make use of them for the furthering of the Kingdom of God. This man simply wants to do his own thing, refusing to be part of God's program. He resents the fact there is a God who makes demands, and in rebellion, buries the precious gift given to him. Perhaps in his pride, he is angry that he only has one talent in comparison to the others.

The sad thing is that this angry servant misses out on the joy the others had in seeing their investments grow. You hear their excitement when they report, "You gave me five talents, see, I have made five more." The problem with the resentful is that they try to create their own rules and expect to succeed, to be happy. As I said in my homily a few weeks ago, "God is most severe on those who refuse to be happy."

I sincerely appreciate the testimonies of Al and Linda Grasley and Jake and Jane Miller last weekend at the Masses.
