From the Desk of Our Associate Pastor

The Mass: An Introduction

What would you say to someone from the outside who asked you, "What is a Mass?" How would you even begin? Here are some fundamental truths about the Mass you should embrace with your heart and mind. First, the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCT, # 1324) calls the Mass the "source and summit of the Christian life" and "contains the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ Himself..." No activity we can think of is more important than the Mass. Whether we feel it or not, the Mass is an experience of heaven on earth.



Second, the Mass is a celebration of what God has done for us through the gift of His Son, Jesus Christ. It is therefore called "Eucharist" from the Greek word meaning "thanksgiving," an act of "gratitude," i.e., worship by the whole Church.

Third, the Mass is a ritual sacrifice performed in a dialogue between God and His people. Scripturally, worship is sacrifice. As such, it is an objective, communal act that binds the community to God and each other in the loving sacrifice of His Son shared with us by the Holy Spirit. We, in turn, sacrifice ourselves to God and each other. Though the Mass must speak to us subjectively and individually, it is primarily an objective act of communal worship.

Fourth, the Mass has two major parts; the Liturgy of the Word and the Eucharist proper. "Liturgy" means "work;" worship demands participation as part of the sacrifice. In the Liturgy of the Word, this takes the form of the responses, being attentive to the readings, the singing, the homily, the recitation of the Creed, and the prayers of the faithful. The Offering transitions us into the second great part of the ritual, the Eucharist, the great climax of the Mass, the most holy moment of our lives, uniting us with all the saints to Christ's sacrifice made once and for all. We will have so much more to say about these two major parts of our common worship in the weeks ahead.

Finally, we must embrace the fact that the Mass is a mystery to be experienced, and if we insist on understanding it with our minds, then our intellects will get in the way of our worship. Our souls and hearts must be open to receive this experience of heaven on earth through faith. Simple Childlike faith embraces the mystery and allows God to open up for us heaven on earth in the Mass.







1. Will the Parish Dashboards be updated with the 2024 numbers?

Yes, parish dashboards, as well as the website progress report, will be updated shortly to reflect the 2024 goals and year-to-date results. The parish dashboards show real-time results and the progress report will be updated on a regular basis (weekly, bi-weekly).


