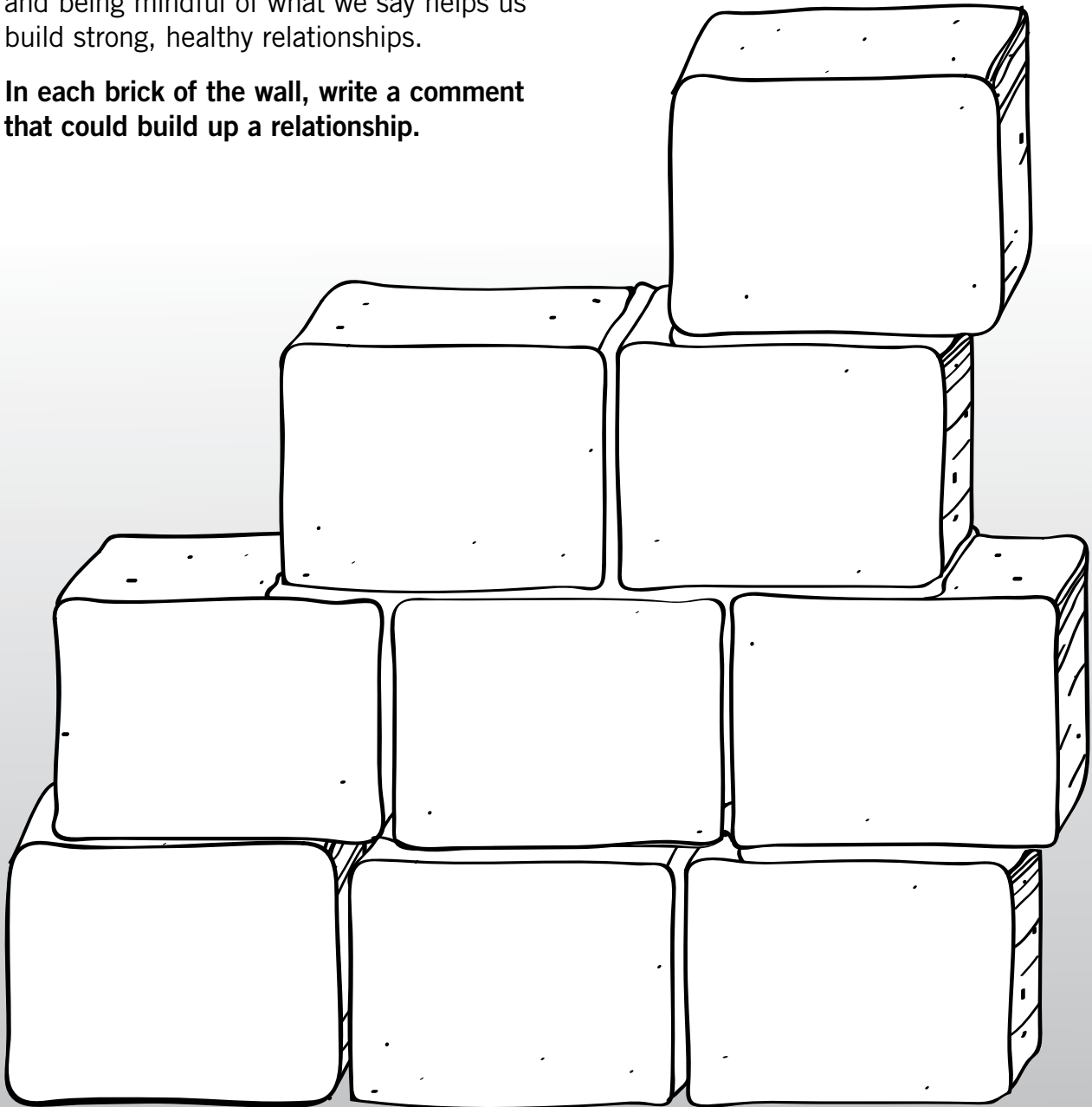

Unhealthy Online Content

Some online spaces contain unhealthy content that devalues and objectifies the human body and sexuality. Such content is called **pornography**. This type of media content promotes a harmful and destructive view of the human person and can undermine our relationship with God and others.

If you encounter pornography while online, don't worry or feel ashamed. Rather, turn it off immediately and let a parent know right away. Do not return to that online space in the future. Purposefully revisiting that online space can pose a threat to your spirit and your safety.

You may receive text or direct messages that contain nudity. If you receive such a message, do not forward it or otherwise share it. Tell a parent immediately. Never send a nude or inappropriate photo or video of yourself to anyone for any reason, and do not take or send them of other people—even when using an app that claims to destroy an image a few seconds after it is sent. Immediately cut off online communication with anyone who makes you uncomfortable or exposes you to inappropriate material. Tell a parent or caregiver right away.

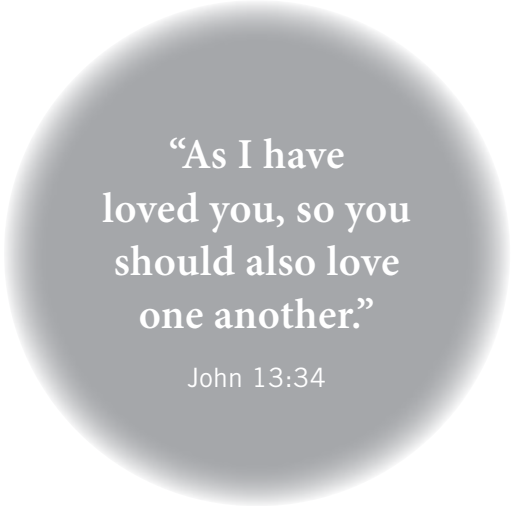
