From the Desk of Our Pastor

The Mass: The Prayer Before the Meal

Worship is sacrifice, and a communal meal always accompanies sacrifice. This whole ritual, the Eucharist, is wrapped up in prayer. Last week, we spoke about the sacrificial nature of the offering. As part of our Worship it is a sacrifice that we need to feel. Everyone must contribute to the table; to come empty-handed is rude. Giving at this sacred meal is crucial. But how we receive it is crucial as well. In coming to this meal, we are about to partake of the “Tree of Life” once lost to humanity by the Fall. The Eucharistic prayers prepare our hearts and minds for this great mystery.



Once the offerings are received and the table is set, we form a family by beginning with what is called a Preface prayer. This changes each week depending on the season of the liturgical year. For instance, we are in Lent now, so the priest has four Lenten Prefaces to choose from. The Preface, however, begins with the priestly proclamation, “The Lord be with you.” This proclamation happens four times during the Mass (at the beginning, before the Gospel, here at the Preface, and the end of the Mass). This is covenantal language. A covenant is a kinship bond established by an oath. For God to be “with” someone is to be bonded as a family. The The Prayer Before the Meal

After the Preface, we lift up our voices in praise of the universal Church on earth, together with the celestial choir of angels and saints with the Sanctus. This comes straight from Isaiah’s vision of God’s throne room and is sung three times. This triple utterance is a Hebrew literary device used to depict perfection. Though God is enthroned above and beyond creation, His glory fills it all. The Sanctus concludes with a line from Ps. 118, “Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord,” which links this vision with Jesus Christ.

Now, we find ourselves deep in the presence of God and proceed to the Eucharistic Prayer. There are four of them. Prayer I is the fullest and most ancient called the Roman Canon and is used on Sundays and high feast days. Prayer II has ancient parts but was composed in Post Vatican II and is appropriate for weekday Masses. Prayer III is preferred on Sundays and feast days during the week. Prayer IV is the longest, outlines the history of salvation, and is not used as much as the others.

Next week, we will explore the transforming depths of the Eucharistic Prayer.

Please pray for our parishioners who are training to be Stephen Ministers. From the end of January to the end of April, Stephen Ministry Leaders at Saint Joseph Catholic Community and Wesley Freedom United Methodist Church are training a new group of five individuals from SJCC and five from WFUMC to be Stephen Ministers. Stephen Minister training is a 50-hour, Christ-centered experience that equips participants with essential caring and relating skills to enable them to effectively care for and walk with those going through difficult times in life.

Stephen Ministers are trained to provide a high level of emotional and spiritual support to those experiencing life crises, extending the reach of SJCC care to people who are hurting.



SJCC needs additional Money Counting team members. Members are responsible for sorting, grouping, and counting collections from Sunday Masses, the Poor Box and other monies received through the Parish Office during the week. **Claims Notice for Victims of Sexual Abuse and Others with
Claims Against the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Baltimore**

If you were sexually abused by any person or entity connected with the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Baltimore (also known as the Archdiocese of Baltimore), a Roman Catholic parish or Roman Catholic school within the geographical area of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Baltimore, or have any claim against the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Baltimore, you must file a claim by May 31, 2024. If you fail to file a timely claim, you may lose the right to assert a claim at a later date.
