From the Desk of Our Pastor

The Mass: Embracing the Mystery!

The table is set, our offerings are on the table, and our souls are prepared. With the Sanctus, we find ourselves before the very throne of God. The priest, acting *in persona Christi Capitis* (in the person of Christ our Head), chooses one of the four Eucharistic Prayers we briefly mentioned in our last letter. Since I tend to Prayer III, I will follow it here.

Following the Sanctus, a prayer affirms God's holiness and directly quotes the Malachi prophecy that one day, pure offerings will be offered in locations worldwide, "from the rising of the sun to its setting" beyond the Temple in Jerusalem. Then comes the "*epiclesis*," a Greek word meaning "invocation," where the priest holds his hands over the elements and calls the Holy Spirit to make them the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ.

Immediately following comes the "Words of Institution," where the very words of Christ are quoted on the eve of His paschal sacrifice. Jesus says, "This is My Body," "This is My Blood." At this most sacred moment in the Gospels, it is crystal clear that Jesus is not speaking in metaphors here. This is a world apart from Jesus's saying, "I am the Good Shepherd," or the "light of the world." Metaphors are figures or images of speech designed to teach a meaning more profound than the literal. This is a "divine pronouncement," exactly like the Father's declaration over Jesus at the Baptism and Transfiguration, "You are my Beloved Son," which means He is both divine and human. These divine pronouncements profoundly link the very Incarnation of Jesus to transforming the elements into the Eucharist. To believe one demands belief in the other.

The Greek word *anamnesis*, "remembrance," in the phrase, "do this in remembrance of Me," has no English equivalent. In English, to "remember" is purely a cognitive act of recalling a past event. The Greek word harkens back to the Hebrew concept of liturgical/sacred time, where the Hebrews, at every Passover, experienced this event as being transported to the one and original Passover event under Moses. This is precisely what Jesus means here. He is the new Passover, both priest and victim and when we celebrate Mass, we are transported back in time to His sacrifice, made once and for all.

Even though this is clear, it defies our reason and senses because the elements look, feel, and taste the same. Jesus is inviting humanity to embrace by faith the mystery of the Eucharist.

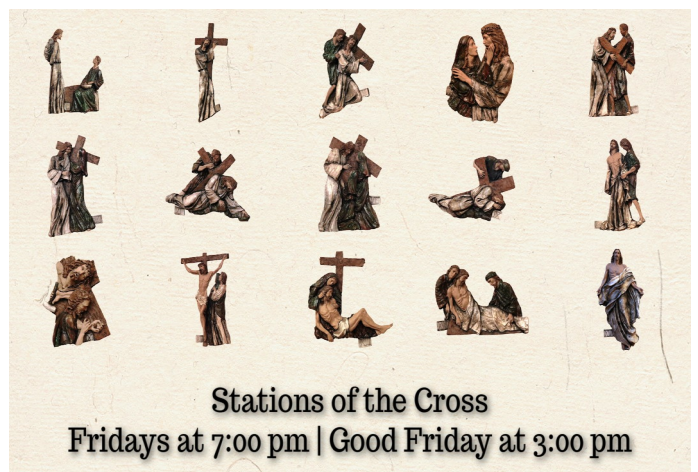

Please pray for our parishioners who are training to be Stephen Ministers. From the end of January to the end of April, Stephen Ministry Leaders at Saint Joseph Catholic Community and Wesley Freedom United Methodist Church are training a new group of five individuals from SJCC and five from WFUMC to be Stephen Ministers. Stephen Minister training is a 50-hour, Christ-centered experience that equips participants with essential caring and relating skills to enable them to effectively care for and walk with those going through difficult times in life.

Stephen Ministers are trained to provide a high level of emotional and spiritual support to those experiencing life crises, extending the reach of SJCC care to people who are hurting.



SJCC needs additional Money Counting team members. 

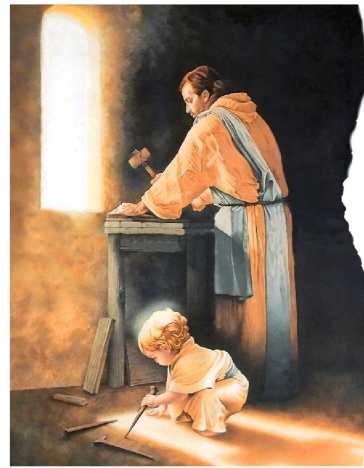

Claims Notice for Victims of Sexual Abuse and Others with Claims Against the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Baltimore

If you were sexually abused by any person or entity connected with the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Baltimore (also known as the Archdiocese of Baltimore), a Roman Catholic parish or Roman Catholic school within the geographical area of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Baltimore, or have any claim against the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Baltimore, you must file a claim by May 31, 2024. If you fail to file a timely claim, you may lose the right to assert a claim at a later date.
