From the Desk of Our Pastor

Palm Sunday, 2024

We have concluded our series on the Mass last week, but I think I will take it into Palm Sunday this week. Palm Sunday is such a special day for us when we read the Triumphal Entry and the haunting Passion Narrative. Herein unfolds the drama of our worship; the great sacrifice of all sacrifices, and the sacrifice of ourselves to the Father in response. But I wish to emphasize here the purpose of the Mass, the "sending" part.

Perhaps you know that our word "Mass" comes from the Latin word "*mitto*," meaning I send. You can right away see how it is used, like in such a word as "transmit," to "send over." The Mass

itself is designed for worship, not evangelization. However, the Mass is meant to create evangelists who are "sent out" into the world "to transmit" the Gospel.

I do believe that our sense of worship is growing here at SJCC, and our liturgy is deeper and richer. We cannot, like non-liturgical churches, make our Mass accessible to non-church people and to be evangelistic to the masses. It is difficult for such a person to walk in and hope to know what is going on. But we can make it holy and beautiful so as that someone new will sense the good, the true, and the beautiful it even if it is not understood. When we ourselves sense this, and enjoy coming to Mass, we will be more apt to invite people to Mass.

I am excited about our future and hope to be here, perhaps to 75 years of age. If the Lord gives me this, I would like to see the church grow to 2000 attendance per week. Since we are running in the 1200s, this would merely be a matter of increasing 100 new persons a year. Here is my short term challenge. All of us know someone who used to come to church before the pandemic. I would like have all of us in the congregation: 1) pray for that person and for an opportunity to invite them back, and 2) reach out to that person and invite them to our great Celebrate Saint Joseph Weekend (April 26th – April 28th).

Now, I know that numbers are not everything, but they are an indicator of the health of our church. Over the last 20 years our numbers have been going down while the population around us has been going up. Since COVID, we have been steadily increasing. Let's join together and keep going forward!
