From the Desk of Our Pastor

The Kingdom of God and the Media

The history of modern media would make for an interesting study. When reading a biography of Lincoln, I was struck by how biased and sensationalized the newspapers were back in his day. Even the trusted Walter Cronkite, whom everyone seemed to trust when I was growing up, acknowledged that objectivity is impossible. Since his time, as we have seen, we have been flooded with every type of news venue, each serving differing ideologies, sensationalizing events, and destroying reputations, all to get the attention of a media-jaded population.



By and large, bad news sells. So as to not be completely

negative, the networks try to end with a positive segment to make people feel good. What the media cannot do, however, is to track the most powerful force in world history, that is, the growth and development of the Kingdom of God. Jesus tells us in the parables of the Scattered Seed and the Mustard Tree that its growth is a mystery to us and completely under the radar. It is that time of the year when we begin to see our plants grow; some we may have planted as seeds. Though we can help seeds grow by watering and conditioning the soil, we cannot make them grow. Moreover, we see the results of the growing plants, but we cannot penetrate what is going on within the plants to make life happen.

The media will always be superficial; it cannot penetrate the mystery of history. Sure, there are famous people who make the news for both good and ill, but what really drives the Kingdom of God are the "invisible people," like you and me, whose works of selfless love are done out of sight of the cameras. What we do in prayer and deeds cannot be captured; even our own left hands, as Jesus teaches, do not know what our right hands are doing. What started very small with the Apostles has mysteriously grown into a massive tree and continues to grow, existing on earth as a very visible tree that protects and nourishes the "birds" in Jesus' parable, that is, the nations.

As for us "invisible people," our Epistle reading tells us to be courageous and quietly do our part in our short lives. We should long to go home, that is, heaven, yet deeply aware that there will be a time when the whole scroll of history, as it really is, will be revealed at the Judgement Seat of Christ, and our invisible part in it will be exposed to all.


