From the Desk of Our Associate Pastor....



Dear Friends in Christ,

This week (3-9 November) is National Vocation Awareness Week: an annual week-long celebration of the Catholic Church in the United States dedicated to promoting vocations to the priesthood, diaconate, and consecrated life through prayer and education, and to renew our prayers and support for those who are considering one of these particular vocations.

As the Second Vatican Council teaches, the universal call to holiness is the fundamental vocation of every Christian. We are called to “be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect,” to “be holy” as God is holy (Matt 5:48; 1 Peter 1:15). How we do that is accomplished through our secondary vocations as husband and father, wife and mother, deacon, priest, and/ or consecrated religious.

This week, we are asked to pray more fervently than usual for God to call more men to the diaconate and priesthood, to call more women and men to religious life—and for those He calls to respond joyfully. In praying for an increase in vocations, we’re not asking God to give us something He doesn’t want to give.

Lastly, we need to normalize vocations to the diaconate, priesthood, and religious life. Being a priest or consecrated religious is not an extraordinary way of life for extraordinary men and women. Being a priest or religious is an ordinary way of life for ordinary Christian men and women who understand that the extraordinary thing is being Christian in the first place. The Sacrament that makes radical demands on us isn’t ordination, it’s Baptism.

Those who are living the Christian life in its depth—who understand the radical demands of Baptism—they can get on with the business of casting away their lives in generosity. Is it hard to be a priest? Of course! But it’s harder to be a Christian! And it’s no harder to be a priest than to be a husband and a father. Any Christian life—any sacramental life—requires sacrifice, because it’s a participation in the way of the Cross. And it’s that effort to die to self, to carry the Cross, to believe the Gospel, to repent of our sins, to live the life of the new creation—that calls forth heroism and generosity.

If any of you think God may be calling you to the priesthood or religious life, please contact me.

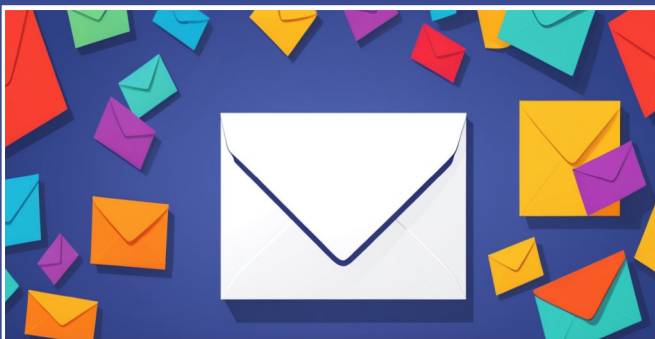

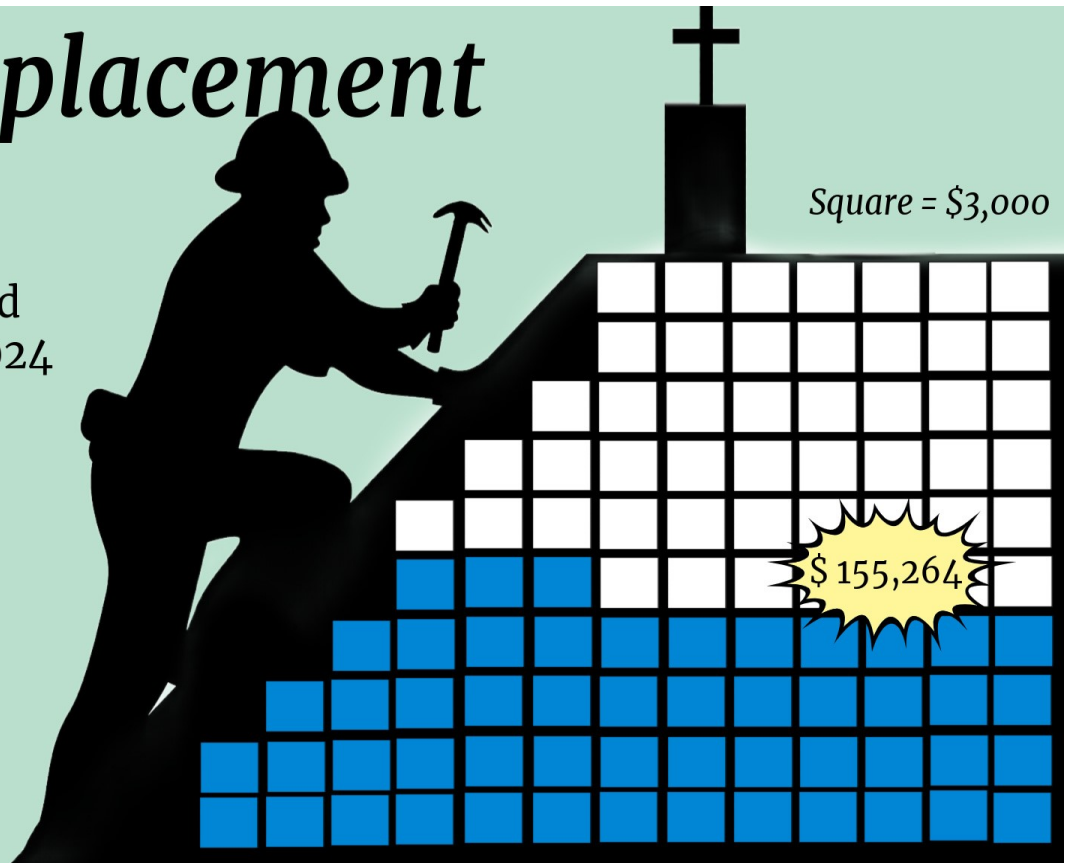
