From the Desk of Our Clergy ...

Dear Friends in Christ,

Last week, we began our historical survey of the Sacrament of Confirmation as we explored the testimony of Scripture. This week, let's explore the practice of the early Church.

Pope Paul VI affirms that Confirmation finds its origin in the practice of the Apostolic Church:

The Apostles—following the will of Christ—communicated to the newly baptized Christians the gift of the Holy Spirit by the laying on of hands. This gift was to complete the grace of Baptism (cf. Acts 8:15-17; 19:5-6). This explains why, in the letter to the Hebrews (cf. Heb 6:2), the doctrine on Baptism and the laying on the hands is mentioned among the first elements of Christian formation. The imposition of hands is rightly recognized by the Catholic tradition as the origin of the sacrament of Confirmation, which in a certain way perpetuates the grace of Pentecost in the Church (*Divinæ Consortium Naturæ*).

As the early church grew, the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation were celebrated in one continuous rite of initiation leading up to the reception of the Eucharist. Until the late 4th century, the Church had no rite called confirmation. According to *The Apostolic Tradition*, Christian initiation (at least in Rome) consisted of Baptism, prayer, the laying on of hands, anointing with oil (the seal), and the kiss of peace. Prior to this, there was a 3-year catechumenate, an election, some pre-baptismal rites involving fasting and exorcism, and—right before the Baptism—a renunciation of sin. The Canons of Laodicea stipulate that Baptism is administered by “the bishops and presbyters of the Church,” and that those “who are baptized must after Baptism be anointed with the heavenly chrism, and be partakers of the Kingdom of Christ.”

While the liturgies of the Church included the imposition of hands and the anointing with holy Chrism, the East emphasized the anointing, whereas the West emphasized the laying on of hands by the bishop. The 4th century Council of Elvira instructed that a person baptized by someone other than the bishop was to be brought to the bishop so that the Baptism be perfected by the laying on of hands. This second anointing completed the Sacrament of Baptism and was gradually recognized in the Latin Church as the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Although he didn't explicitly use the term 'confirmation,' Saint Ambrose accounts for the earliest recorded description of the meaning of the sacrament:

Wherefore recollect that thou hast received the spiritual seal ... God the Father hath sealed thee, Christ the Lord hath confirmed thee, and hath given the earnest of the Spirit in thy heart, as thou hast learned from the apostolic lesson (De Mysteriis).

The earliest explicit mention of Confirmation comes from the Council of Riez (439), which mentions a rite following Baptism that was usually celebrated by a bishop. The fact that this anointing is itself a proper rite and that it is ordinarily performed by the bishop indicates that it is not part of the Sacrament of Baptism. A few years later, the Third Council of Arles affirmed that a bishop should perform the anointing of the newly baptized with Chrism. Once again, the administration of Confirmation is left to the bishop—at least in the Latin Church.

The earliest explicit record of the term 'confirmation' in the West is found in the canons of the 5th century Council of Orange: No minister who has the office of baptizing shall begin without Chrism: for it was agreed among us that there shall be one chrismation [in baptism]. When anyone for any reason does not receive chrism in baptism, the bishop shall be advised of this at the confirmation. The Eastern Churches (and the Latin Churches in Spain) observed this single anointing with Chrism performed by a priest.

Some think that the separation of the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation began in the local church of Rome where the anointing that came to be known as Confirmation was separated from the anointing that immediately followed Baptism. The separation of the anointings seems to be for ecclesial reasons rather than theological ones: in the Latin Church, there was a greater desire for the bishop's involvement. The administration of these two anointings at different times and by different ministers (one by the priest and one by the bishop), caused confusion. In a letter to Decentius, the Bishop of Gubbio, Pope Innocent I explained the meaning of the two anointings:

For, though the presbyters are priests of the second order, yet they do not have the fullness of the pontificate. That this pontifical authority of confirming or of conferring the Spirit the Paraclete is proper only to bishops is clearly shown, not only by the Church's custom, but by that passage of the Acts of the Apostles which affirms that Peter and John were directed to confer the Holy Spirit to those who were already baptized (cf. Acts 8:14-17). For it is allowed to presbyters when they baptise either in the absence of the bishop or in his presence to anoint with chrism those who are being baptized, though only with chrism consecrated by the bishop; but not to sign their forehead with the same oil, which is reserved to the bishops when they confer the Spirit the Paraclete.

From the 5th century, there's a detaching of Confirmation from Baptism. No longer would the two gestures comprise a single liturgical rite, and the celebration of Confirmation in the Latin Church is clearly the property of the bishop.

After Easter, we'll return to the development of the sacrament of Confirmation.


