## From the Desk of Our Clergy ...

Dear Friends in Christ,

Before Easter, we began an in-depth look at the Sacrament of Confirmation. We've looked at the testimony of Scripture and the practice of the early Church; this week, we continue our historical survey in order to better understand this Sacrament of Initiation.

The first Christian communities were established in cities, and the Liturgy was celebrated by the local bishop, assisted by his priests and deacons. It's clear from St Paul's letters that many of these local churches were 'house churches'—that the earliest communities met in the homes of believers. Due to intermittent persecutions by the civil authorities for the first three centuries, the Christian faithful often worshipped secretly. This meant that there were no established parishes, no buildings erected for the purpose of public corporate Christian worship.

After Constantine promulgated the Edict of Milan (313), Christians were free to worship throughout the Roman Empire. As a result, many converted and were baptized, and as Christianity spread from cities to the countryside, cathedrals and parish churches were established. The rapid growth of the Church caused a certain problem, though: travel wasn't easy, and it soon became impossible for bishops to preside at every celebration of Baptism within their territory. The bishops of the Eastern Churches solved the problem by delegating the celebration of the Sacraments of Initiation to priests, though the bishops reserved the consecration of the Myron (Chrism) to themselves. This practice of the Eastern Churches (both Catholic and Orthodox) has continued unchanged throughout the centuries; to this day, they administer the Sacraments of Initiation at once, regardless of the recipient's age. The bishops of the Latin Church also delegated Baptism to priests, but they reserved to themselves the administration of the second post-baptismal anointing and imposition of hands. The local bishop would lay hands and perform the anointing on the baptized whenever he visited his parishes. So in the West, the celebration of Confirmation was deferred until the time of the bishop's pastoral visitation (which could be years after Baptism).

Distance was not the only cause for separation in the Latin Church; mortality rates and expected lifespan also played a role. By the 6th century, the majority of those living in Rome were Christians. Infant baptisms were the norm, so there were fewer adult converts to baptize. Because of the risk of death to newborns, the Church baptized infants straightaway. The immediacy with which children were to be baptized made it difficult for the bishop to initiate all the infants in his diocese. So priests celebrated Baptism, but

Confirmation—since it was reserved to the bishop—was celebrated at some point after Baptism. As the celebration of Confirmation was deferred, so was the reception of First Communion deferred until the bishop could visit the parish in order to administer both Confirmation and First Communion in the same celebration.

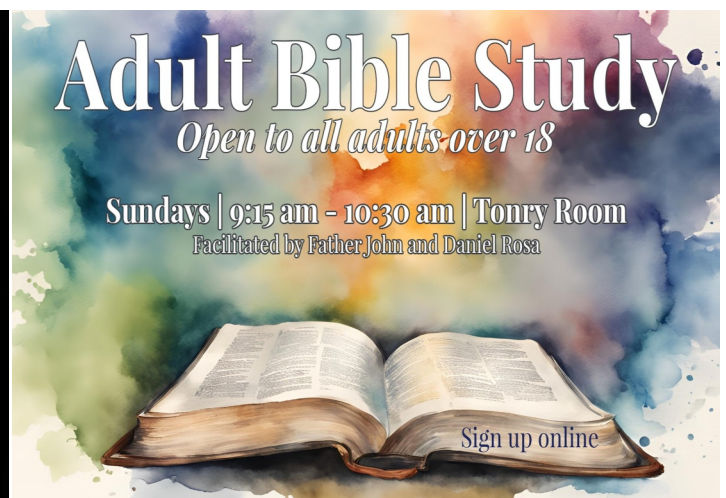
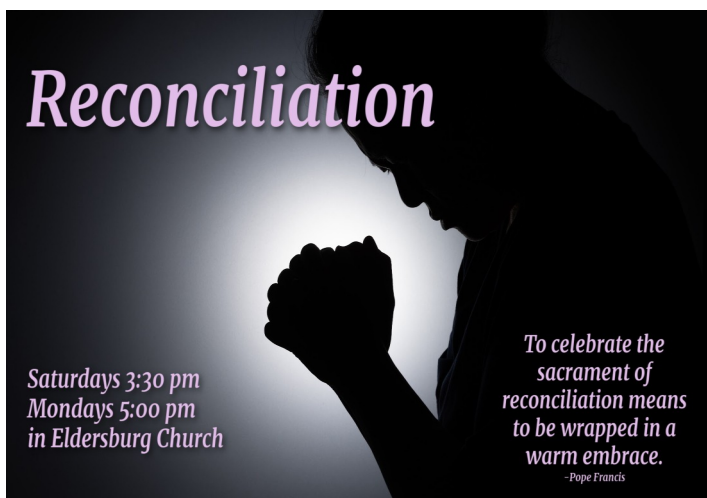
By the Medieval period, the two practices of the East and West were clearly distinct. In the East, priests were the ordinary ministers of the Sacrament of Confirmation, confirming those whom they baptized. In the West, bishops were the ordinary ministers of Confirmation, as they confirmed those already baptized. The resulting separation of Baptism and Confirmation in the Latin Church made possible the disruption of the sacramental order of Christian initiation.

To maintain the ancient order of the Sacraments of Initiation in the Latin Church, admission to the Eucharist was held off until after the age of reason. While Confirmation was restored to the age of reason, the Eucharist was delayed until the ages of 11 or 12, or, in some places, even as late as fourteen (cf. R. Barrett, “Confirmation,” 703). This continued until the Fourth Lateran Council (1215) declared that pastors should administer both the Sacrament of Penance and First Communion at the age of reason. Despite the Council’s decision, the status quo continued for centuries; the faithful received Confirmation around the age of reason and First Communion a few years later.

Next Sunday is Good Shepherd Sunday, and the bulletin letter will focus on that theme. Afterwards, we’ll return to our exploration of the Sacrament of Confirmation.


