From the Desk of Our Clergy ...

Dear Friends in Christ,

Today, we continue our investigation into the history of the Sacrament of Confirmation so as to better understand the importance of this mystery of faith in the Christian life.

In August 1910, the Sacred Congregation for the Discipline of the Sacraments called for the return of First Communion to “the time when a child begins to reason, that is about the seventh year, more or less” (*Quam Singulari*, 1). However, the decision of Pope Pius X in *Quam Singulari* had unexpected consequences regarding Confirmation, as it disrupted the sacramental order.

Interestingly, *Quam singulari* makes no reference at all to Confirmation. From the mid-19th century until the promulgation of this decree, the order between Confirmation and Eucharist varied, at least in some places—even though Pope Leo XIII desired that the proper order for the Sacraments of Initiation be respected. Nevertheless, Pope Pius X’s decree to lower the age of First Communion for children who had reached the age of reason resulted in the standard practice for children to be admitted to Communion before they were confirmed. Pope Pius X expected Confirmation would continue to be administered prior to the reception of First Communion, but of course, this did not happen. Although reception of First Communion returned to the age of reason, Confirmation continued to be administered in adolescence.

The Second Vatican Council expressed a desire in *Sacrosanctum Concilium* that the Rite of Confirmation be “revised and the intimate connection which [Confirmation] has with the whole of Christian initiation should be more lucidly set forth” (SC, 71). The Fathers of the Second Vatican Council has previously taught: “it must never be forgotten that our reception of Baptism and Confirmation is ordered to the Eucharist” (SC, 17). “Accordingly,” the constitution continues, “our pastoral practice should reflect a more unitary understanding of the process of Christian initiation.”

The Council Fathers declared in the decree *Presbyterorum ordinis* that “those under instruction are introduced by stages to a sharing in the Eucharist, and the faithful, already marked with the seal of Baptism and Confirmation, are through the reception of the Eucharist fully joined to the Body of Christ.” In these texts, we see the ancient sacramental order restated and reaffirmed. The Second Vatican Council stated clearly and repeatedly that the Eucharist—not Confirmation—completes Christian initiation and fully incorporates the baptized into the Church.



The *Order of Christian Initiation of Adults* was promulgated in 1972. It refers to Baptism as the “first sacrament” which “pardons all our sins, rescues us from the power of darkness, and brings us to the dignity of adopted children” (no. 2). Furthermore, Confirmation “makes us more completely the image of the Lord and fills us with the Holy Spirit.” Immediately after consideration of Baptism and Confirmation, the *Order of Christian Initiation of Adults* states: “Finally, coming to the table of the eucharist, we eat the flesh and drink the blood of the Son of Man so that we may have eternal life and show forth the unity of God’s people.” By using the words “first” and “finally,” we see that although Baptism and Eucharist are the major sacraments of the Christian life, it is the reception of first Communion that completes Christian initiation.

By maintaining the principle of order regarding the reception of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist, the *Order of Christian Initiation of Adults* affirms what is already found in both the *Rite of Baptism for Children* and the *Rite of Confirmation*. Throughout our liturgical books, the clear norm is that Confirmation precedes the reception of the Eucharist. Anything else is exceptional and not intended to be the ordinary practice of the Latin Church.



Walk with One Initiative

There is someone in your life right now who Jesus longs to call to Himself. He wants to spark a relationship with them and bless them with his sacraments.

Mission

Catholics across the U.S. are saying “yes” to a special form of heart-to-heart accompaniment called the **Walk With One** initiative.

Through **Walk with One**, we hope to develop a Eucharistic culture within our community, where we each see ourselves being taken by the Holy Spirit, broken, and poured out to meet the needs of another person and to bring them into the fullness of life in Christ.

Invite



Invite the person to take one step closer to Jesus and the Church

Follow the promptings of the Holy Spirit to invite the person you have been walking with to take a concrete next step in fostering a relationship with Jesus and the Church. Consider inviting them to a small group, a service opportunity, or a social event. Offer to accompany them to adoration or the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Alternately, invite the person over for dinner where you can have a personal conversation and share your faith.



Make several invitations over time, and keep praying for your friend.

Overview

Step 1 - Identify

- Pray to discern the name of someone the Holy Spirit wants you to walk with. Ask God who He wants you to accompany on their journey home to the Church.

Step 2 - Intercede

- Pray for the person. Ask God to remove whatever obstacles are making it difficult for this person to draw closer to Christ and His Church.

Step 3 - Connect

- Look for ways to build a deeper relationship with this person. Listen deeply for promptings from the Holy Spirit as you get to know your friend's joys and struggles.

Step 4 - Invite

- When the time is right, invite your friend to take a concrete next step in fostering a personal relationship with Jesus and the Church. This might mean joining you for a small group, adoration, or Mass on Sunday.
