From the Desk of Our Clergy ...

Dear Friends in Christ,

Today, we conclude our study of the Sacrament of Confirmation.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that “the effect of the sacrament of Confirmation is the full outpouring of the Holy Spirit as once granted to the apostles on the day of Pentecost” (no. 1302). This outpouring of the Spirit “brings an increase and deepening of baptismal grace” which bears fruit in the lives of the faithful (no. 1303).



The introduction to the *Rite of Confirmation* explains that this sealing with the Holy Spirit “conforms believers more perfectly to Christ and strengthens them so that they bear witness to Christ for the building up of his body in faith and love. They are so marked with the character or seal of the Lord that the sacrament of confirmation cannot be repeated” (no. 2). The introduction later explains that the sacramental actions of the laying on of hands and the anointing with Chrism “conforms [the one confirmed] more closely to Christ and gives him the grace of spreading the Lord’s presence among men” (no. 9).



Though the introduction provides no documentary sources for these effects of Confirmation, they are clearly drawn from *Divinae consortium naturae*, Pope Paul VI’s apostolic constitution on Confirmation, who drew from the documents of the Second Vatican Council. The Council Fathers spoke of four effects of Confirmation in the dogmatic constitution *Lumen gentium*:

- First, through the laying on of hands and the anointing with Sacred Chrism, “the Holy Spirit endows [the faithful] with special strength” (*LG*, 11).
- Second, by the sacramental character received in Confirmation, the faithful are “bound more intimately to the Church” and, therefore, also to Christ (*LG*, 11).
- Third, because of the special strength and the character received, the faithful “are more strictly obliged to spread and defend the faith both by word and by deed as true witnesses of Christ” (*LG*, 11). We see, then, that these first three effects of the completion of baptismal grace are tightly bound together.
- Finally, the Fathers of the Second Vatican Council emphasized the unity of the second and third sacraments of initiation, saying, “those under instruction are introduced by stages to a sharing in the Eucharist, and the faithful, already marked with the seal of Baptism and Confirmation, are through the reception of the Eucharist fully joined to the Body of Christ” (*PO*, 5). It is “by virtue of their Baptism and Confirmation, and strengthened by the Eucharist” that the Christian laity, said Pope Benedict XVI, “are called to live out the radical newness brought by Christ wherever they find themselves” (*Sacramentum Caritatis*, 78).

Reflecting on the purpose of this special strength and character received with the grace of Confirmation and rooted first in Baptism, Pope John Paul II said:

In speaking about participation in the apostolic mission of the Church, there is no doubt that in virtue of Baptism and Confirmation, a woman – as well as a man – is made a sharer in the threefold mission of Jesus Christ, Priest, Prophet, and King, and is thereby charged and given the ability to fulfill the fundamental apostolate of the Church: evangelization (Christifideles Laici, 51).

And Pope Benedict XVI said, “It must never be forgotten that our reception of Baptism and Confirmation is ordered to the Eucharist. Accordingly, our pastoral practice should reflect a more unitary understanding of the process of Christian initiation” (*Sacramentum Caritatis*, 17).

Confirmation orders us to the Eucharist because it completes the grace of Baptism. So important is the theological understanding of Confirmation, that it is incorporated into the *Code of Canon Law*: “The sacrament of confirmation strengthens the baptized and obliges them more firmly to be witnesses of Christ by word and deed and to spread and defend the faith. It imprints a character, enriches by the gift of the Holy Spirit the baptized continuing on the path of Christian initiation, and binds them more perfectly to the Church” (CIC, 879).

We look forward to celebrating Confirmation with and for the youth of our parish, especially those in 4th grade. May the Lord strengthen His young servants, empower them for His service, and sustain them all the days of their lives.

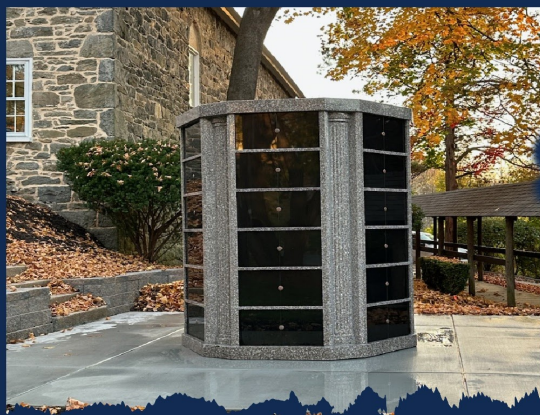
