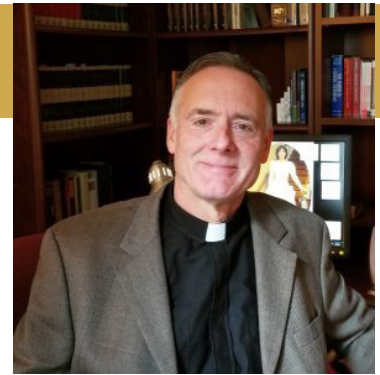

Thoughts Shared by Our Pastor...



Leave Your Opinions at the Door!

My Dear Family,

Around every family table, there is “table talk.” Much of it is easy conversation about the day, but sometimes it can get tense when opinions arise and passions are stirred. The truth about opinions is that they are the lowest form of knowledge. Opinions grow when we think our way through life based on our subjective experiences, and they inevitably come into conflict with others who think their way through their experiences differently. The more wedded we are to our opinions, the duller and more cantankerous we become. Our opinions can become idols, and where there is idolatry, there is always strife.

When we gather around Jesus, we must be willing to set aside our opinions, regardless of their nature. What matters most is how we think. Learning how to think is no easy matter. I will never forget the moment my doctoral advisor, at the beginning of my program, told me, “Mr. Worgul, you do not know how to think.” We all, no matter who we are, begin with untrained minds, and unless we learn how to think, we can never get out of the fog of our opinions. Going forward, I ask you to trust Jesus and His Church, and let go of your opinions. I will do the same; it is not my intention to trade my opinions in place of yours. Jesus and His Church are inseparable, just as the head is inseparable to the body. Jesus and His Church do not teach opinion, but revelation, that is, truth revealed to us from God Himself. The Church is an expert on the human person. We must together pursue the mind of Christ and think our way through tough issues like Christ did. To achieve this, it will take an immense amount of faith and courage.

The challenge is that we are so wedded to our opinions that we confuse them with our very selves, our very identity. We fear that if we lose our opinions, we will no longer be our own unique persons. The truth is that our opinions just make us like everyone else in our “circle” parroting the same thing over and over, separating us from others, demonizing them.

We will look to the Holy Spirit to assist us in our efforts to think like Jesus. When the Holy Spirit teaches us to think like Jesus, we all, in some mysterious way, “come into our own.” Though we think alike, we all come out different; a unique expression of Jesus in this world. One of the meanings of “holy” is “unique.” Possessing the mind of Christ is not about opinions, but about holiness.

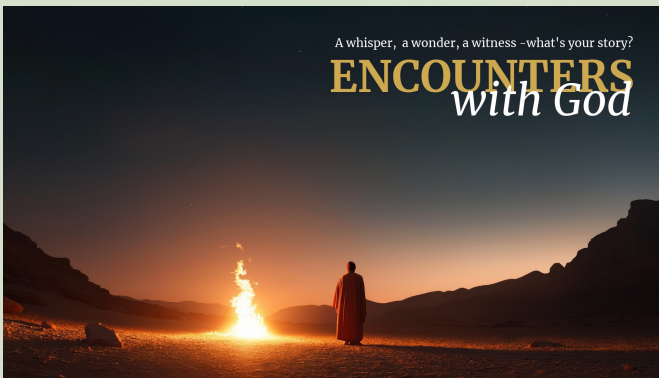

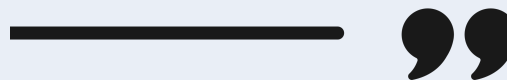



Annual Financial Report to the Parish Fiscal Year 2024-2025

Reflecting on this past fiscal year, we are reminded of Psalm 127:1 "Unless the LORD builds the house, its builders labor in vain". This proverb suggests that human efforts in building a house, whether a literal structure or a life, are pointless without God's guidance and blessing. The verse serves as a reminder that true success and security come from relying on God, not just on hard work or human ability, and it emphasizes the importance of making God the foundation of all endeavors. This year we brought our endeavors to the Lord in prayer and relied on his guidance and providence. The Lord has provided for our structure while allowing us to grow and be a light.

Promising financial indicators of this growth include an increase of 3.6% in Offertory Collections over the prior fiscal year. Although there was a decrease in Envelopes it was more than offset by an increase in electronic giving via Faith Direct. Loose collections increased \$4.6K over FY24. Joyfully, we noted a 10% increase in our average weekly mass attendance.

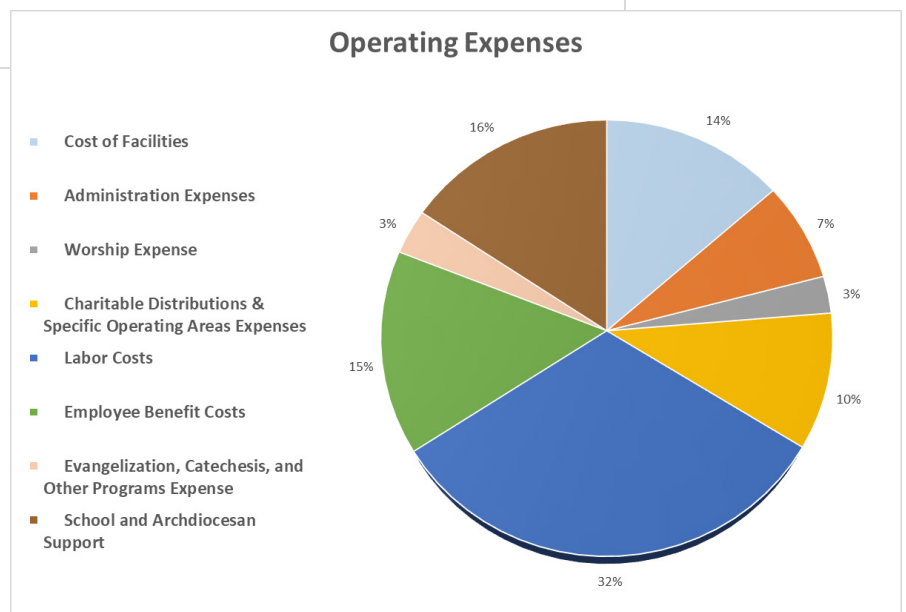
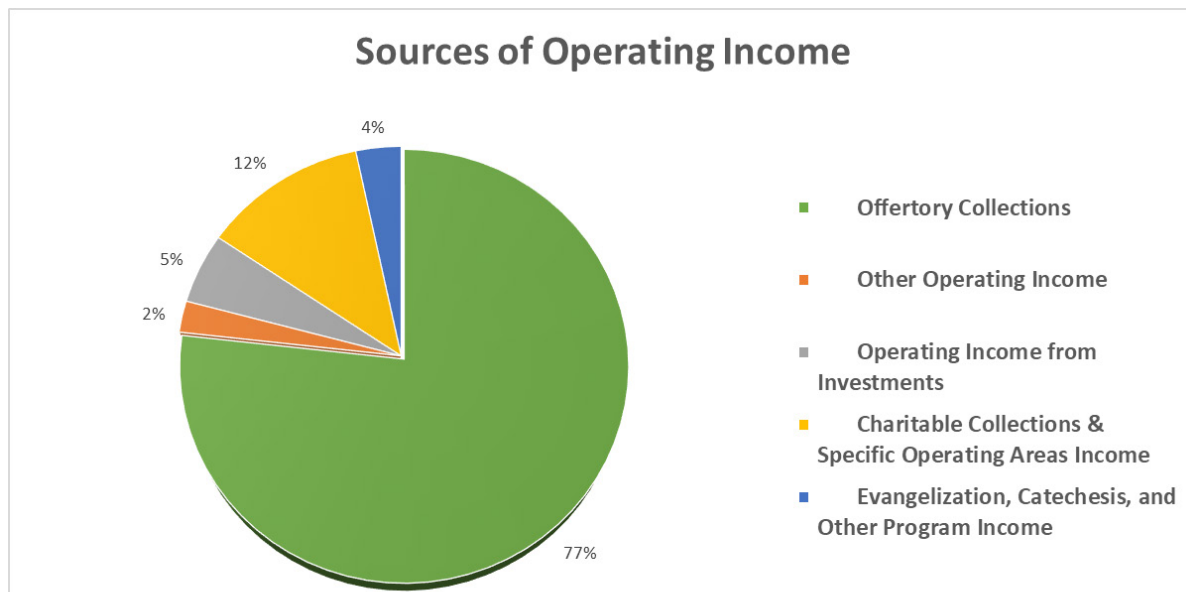
The church's other sources of income are reflected in the accompanying Financial Statement and include other operating income, interest income on savings & investment accounts, charitable collections & specific operating area income, and faith formation & sacramental preparation program income. Other operating income increased over FY24 due to an escalation in the number of funerals and weddings. Amongst these categories, Specific operating area income experienced the largest decrease compared to the prior year as the sales of niches in the Columbarium dropped from the inaugural year's sales. Faith formation and sacramental preparation income fell due to decreased enrollment.

As we are all experiencing in our personal lives, utility, property & liability insurance, and equipment expenses continue to increase, as is indicated by the 7% increase in Facilities Costs. Labor and Benefit expenses increased in FY25 due to filling staff positions that were vacant in the prior year, compounded by the increase in the cost of medical insurance. Expenses related to faith formation and sacramental preparation were less than the prior year (consistent with income).

Fiscal Year 2025 saw the replacement of the Roof on the Eldersburg campus buildings. The special project collections of \$260K this year, added to FY24's collections of \$59K resulted in a total of \$319K - covering the cost of the Roof in its entirety. Other capital expenditures included \$61K to replace the HVAC units for the Cassidy Center and two lower-level classrooms, \$18K to reconstruct walls & ceiling of the Sykesville Church basement due to termite damage. Even after funding these necessary physical needs of our campus, we were able to enhance the liturgical and welcoming experience through improvements to our Fellowship space in the Cassidy Center and our streaming equipment in the church. Looking to the future, we have engaged an architect to render designs for the expansion and beautification of Our Lady of the Pilar Chapel, with permission from the Archdiocese secured for a fundraising campaign scheduled to kick off in FY26.

In summary, we have been holding our own while still addressing the demands of the physical plant. God has provided, and we are grateful for your generosity. It remains clear we must continue to strive to operate within our means while saving for the future. There is so much we have yet to do, and we must, as a church, develop a greater sense of stewardship so we can grow and expand our ministries and prepare for enriched family faith formation. We look forward to being able to make our spaces more conducive to worship and to running programs for parishioners.

Finally, we want to express our heartfelt appreciation to each of you for your sacrifices. Last year, we celebrated the Year of Formation, and we hope you were able to take advantage of our family-centered youth formation, our new “Bearing the Beams of Love” series on family life and morals, and our numerous Bible studies and small groups. Our church is blessed with a growing number of baptisms, and we are witnessing an increasing number of people participating in the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA). Once again, we need to continue to let the Lord guide us as we build the house and together, we can anticipate the remarkable things we will achieve in the coming year with your active involvement and His guidance.
